Two separate building models, one for main house and one for garage. House is one story, ranch style and comprised of two separate pieces that fit together, with the addition of a greenhouse-type building addition. Also, the roof, 3 roof elements and 6 pieces of cardboard that represent the patio are separate. Garage is one story with separate roof. Came with car that is numbered 1968.4536.2. House model has separate pieces of furniture including chairs, tables and beds. Handwritten on patio piece: House faces South 23 degrees to West. Address of house is 9605 Hilltop Rd. Bellevue, WA, which is in the Vuecrest Community. This subdivision was one of the first modern subdivisions in the area, developed in 1947 by R. E. Rogers. The architect of this house was Thomas Albert Smith.
